

## NEW KILPATRICK CHURCH

Step back in time at New Kilpatrick Parish Church, a hidden gem with a rich history dating back to the 13th century. The stunning church, built in 1808 on the grounds of an earlier 1649 structure, invites you to explore its remarkable past. Admire the exquisite stained-glass windows, featuring masterpieces by acclaimed artists Stephen Adams, Alfred and Gordon Webster.


## Bishopbriggs Library: Talk on Cawder Estate

Bishopbriggs Library is a former Victorian school building situated in the centre of Bishopbriggs. The building was fully refurbished as a library and community hub in 2018 and includes a multipurpose room and meeting spaces. The library has a Thomas Muir exhibition and local history section.

Enjoy a talk from Carol Primrose about the nearby Cawder Estate and its mansion Cawder House, noting the Roman remains, the early medieval history (both religious and political), the turbulent wars of independence and then the Jacobite uprisings, and the gracious living of the 19th and 20th centuries, marked by wars and golf.

## **Cadder Church**

## **Fort Theatre**

## **Auld Kirk Museum**

The Auld Kirk and its graveyard, 380 years old this year, form one of the finest and oldest sites in Kirkintilloch. The building features an 18th century pulpit and a 1663 Gerhard Koster bell, which is now part of the museum collection. In the churchyard, tombstones have been laid flat or propped against the boundary walls.

The museum within the building showcases objects primarily related to the social and industrial history of East Dunbartonshire, along with hosting temporary exhibitions. Permanent exhibits include objects spanning from the Neolithic era to Roman times, and from the industrial past to the 20th century. The museum also features the popular Annual Art Exhibition and a small display for St. Ninian's High School's 150<sup>th</sup> year.

## Deafblind Scotland Learning and Development Centre

The Deafblind Scotland Learning and Development Centre was purpose built following a fundraising campaign led by deafblind people. The building is fully accessible for deafblind people and continues to be developed.

Join us for a guided tour showcasing accessibility features, the center's journey through a visual exhibit, a look at the specialist IT suite, and a chance to try equipment from our lending library, such as the Ruby Magnifier and Alexa Show. You'll also have the opportunity to visit our recording studio, try out Braille and Moon writing, and explore our tactile art exhibition. Additionally, a short animation film on human rights for deafblind individuals will be available for viewing. Take a guided walk down our tactile path and experience it with simulation spectacles to understand varying eye conditions.

The BSL and Guiding Technique sessions will need to be prebooked. There will be a late morning and early afternoon session available.




## St Mary's Parish Church



# William Patrick Library: Display by Kirkintilloch and District Society of Antiquaries

The William Patrick Library opened at its current location in 1994 to replace the town library at Camphill House, Peel Park. It was refurbished in 2012. The stained-glass panels from Middlecroft House, the former home of Rita Cowan Taketsuru, the mother of Japanese Whisky, are housed inside. Visit Archives and Local Studies on the first floor of the library during its opening hours to discover more about your local history.

The Kirkintilloch and District Society of Antiquaries was founded in 1933 and is the local history society for Kirkintilloch. They hold meetings from October to April and organise outings to local sites of historical and cultural interest.

Following the success of the 2023 event, the Antiquaries are thrilled to present a new exhibition in the library foyer, focusing on "Significant residents of Kirkintilloch and their legacy." This time, we will showcase a fresh group of personalities, featuring archive and newly taken photographs of their residences, workplaces, and other associated sites, including their graves and memorials in the Old Aisle Cemetery.


## Old Aisle Cemetery: Walk by the Kirkintilloch and District Society of Antiquaries

## **Campsie Memorial Hall:**

## Display by Campsie Local History Group

The Campsie Memorial Hall is a vital community facility that hosts various clubs, Community Council Meetings, and public social events. It was initially constructed around 1868 by Mr Hanbury Lennox. The hall was transformed in 1954, thanks to the support of the local "Welcome Home/Comfort Fund" and "in Memory of the War Dead" funding. Since its inception, the Hall has been the central venue for Lennoxtown, playing a crucial role in providing education, communication, and cohesion within individuals, families, and the community.

Come along and see this wonderful community venue before it closes in 2025 for a major refurbishment to help secure its future for the next generation of users and the community of Lennoxtown and surrounding areas. A chance to see the building while learning about the history and future of the region.

Don't miss the opportunity to visit the Hall as the Campsie Local History Group showcases fascinating displays from previous presentations. You can explore examples of content from reprinted Campsie in the Great War (WW1) and newly-printed Campsie in WW2 Books. Engage in discussions with members of the New Book Team and seize the chance to purchase these intriguing books. If the weather permits, there will also be guided tours of the High Kirk Cemetery nearby.

Campsie Memorial Hall is open from 10am – 5pm on Saturday 7 and Sunday 8 September.







## Gavin's Mill

Gavin's Mill is one of the oldest buildings in Milngavie, dating from at least the 16th century. Powered by the Allander Water, it operated as a grain mill and latterly a sawmill until about 1960 when a fire gutted the interior. It was bought and reconstructed by architect Bert Morris and functioned as an office and restaurant until 2014. In 2017 the Gavin's Mill community project took it over and opened as a fair-trade shop and café.

Learn from volunteers about the history of the mill and the aim of the project to help develop sustainable communities at home and abroad.

# **Lillie Art Gallery:** Guided tour of the Gallery Store

The Lillie Art Gallery is a purpose-built gallery opened in 1962. It owes its existence to local banker and artist Robert Lillie (1867-1949), who left a substantial number of his own artworks as well as funds to build the gallery.

Since 1962, this founding bequest of artworks has been developed to form a collection of Scottish art dating from the 1880s to the present day. Around 450 works are contained in the collection, which includes paintings, prints, drawings and a small collection of sculpture and ceramics.

## Caldwell Halls

The Caldwell Halls Trust took over the management of the halls in 2010, saving it from closure. Originally a village school, the halls' history dates back to 1813, with the two-story section and the Main Hall added in the 19th century. The Caldwell Halls remains a village landmark and continues to be the hub of village life today.

This Doors Open Day Event is a joint effort between the Caldwell Halls Trust and Torrance & Baldernock Heritage Group, a well-rooted community organisation known for its well-attended monthly talks. The event will feature a film show depicting the history of Torrance and Baldernock, and attendees are encouraged to bring photos and memories of the Caldwell Halls and the wider Torrance and Baldernock communities past and present. During the event, the Main Hall and entrance foyer will be open to the public, and visitors are welcome to explore the upstairs and back garden. The primary activities will take place in the Main Hall and foyer.
